

Properly Notify EMS/Fire and Police if you seek assistance from them and you or a household contact are symptomatic and/or are COVID-19 positive.



Middleton Health Department COVID 19 History Data: March to Present


Confirmed COVID-19 cases in Middleton

Rolling Parade to Appreciate Middleton Family Medicine Health Care Workers

Transfer Station

The Middleton Public Works Department Continues to provide essential services to the residents of Middleton. In particular to COVID-19, They continue to operate and provide burials services at the cemetery and remain staffed at the transfer station to allow residents to utilize the facility. They have been working beyond normal expectations since demand at the transfer station to dispose household items/waste has immensely increased due to families producing more waste: More people are home and also are doing multiple clean out projects. As a reminder, social distancing efforts are required for the staff and the public. Facial coverings are required if social distancing (less than 6 ft) can not be achieved. The best management practice is to just wear a facial covering while leaving the vehicle to dispose of recyclables.
