PHASE 2 APPROACHING

The Middleton Health Department has been extremely busy keeping up with the Phase 2 sector re-openings that are approaching. The Health Department will do it's best to expedite pre-opening inspections to get things such as, but not limited to, semi-public and public pools open, recreational and day camps operational, youth organized sports (those applicable) initiated, along with many other phase 2 sectors and activities that will commence in the very near future.

A planning team has been put in place by Town Administration to handle the process of outdoor dining requests by restaurants. Restaurants do not automatically have the authorization to have outdoor seating unless they have been previously permitted to do so. If they do not, then they will need to contact the Town at middletoncovid19@middletonma.gov to inquire what process they will need to follow to request outdoor dining.
