### AS CERTAIN THINGS REOPEN, KEEP IN MIND,



that many sectors need to follow the MA state guidelines and associated safety protocols/checklist in order to operate. For instance, for Phase 2, youth and adult outdoor sports/leagues that have been allowed to return to play (not all), are only allowed practices, drills, and skills, but no actual scrimmages and games are allowed to be played until Phase 3 anticipated to be in July and beyond.

Semi Public Pools and Public Pools (outdoor only; indoor pools are still to remain closed) must only allow 40% of their members/users occupancy of the pool at a time and chairs and stations must be socially distanced apart. Facial coverings are not required to be worn in the pool(s).

For Middleton, outdoor dining, can be established by restaurants who either have had outdoor dining approved previously within their previously approved areas. For restaurants wanting to implement outdoor dining, they are required to go through an expedited application and review process through the Town of Middleton. This temporary process related to the pandemic has been approved by the Board of Selectmen and removes the long process typically required for outdoor seating review and decisions.

The Building Commissioner, Fire Department, and Health Department quickly review applications to ensure things such as, but not limited to, patron safety (i.e. from vehicular traffic since outdoor dining may take place in a parking lot), noise, fire hazards (tents, outdoor heating apparatus) are considered.
