- **Warrant Approval:** Town Administrator Andy Sheehan provided a brief review of Warrant #2112: Payroll: \$752,783, Bills Payable: \$973,818, noting that the Town Accountant had reviewed the warrant and requested the Board's approval. - **Town Administrator's Report:** Town Administrator Andy Sheehan provided the Board with information and updates on the following:
 - **Winter Parking Ban:** Sheehan announced that the winter parking ban went into effect on December 1. It lasts through April 1. No vehicle may be parked on the street between midnight and 6AM.
 - **Brush Drop Off:** Sheehan announced that a brush drop-off is scheduled for this weekend, December 12th, at the transfer station for anyone with a sticker. If you need a sticker, they can be purchased online on the Town's website, at MiddletonMA.gov.
 - **COVID-19:** Sheehan advised the Board that Middleton now has 53 active COVID cases, and hospitalization rates are rising, as are positivity rates. Elective surgical procedures have been canceled. Thanksgiving turned out to be what experts feared – a spreading event. The Governor rolled back the state reopening plan to phase 3, step 1. Middleton was, for the most part, still at step 1. Additional information is available at Mass.gov. Sheehan urged families to spend the holidays at home with family members only. Avoid gatherings of people outside your household.
 - **Update on Police Chief Search:** Sheehan advised that interviews will take place next Tuesday at the DoubleTree Hotel. Municipal Resources Inc. are holding their assessment center online, rather than in person. A brief discussion ensued. Sheehan added that Chief DiGianvittorio is willing to stay on until a new Chief has been sworn in.
 - **45-Unit Condo Development:** Sheehan advised that the utility and site work has begun on the condo project behind Angelica's. If they build all the units, there will be a donation of \$225,000 (\$5,000/unit) towards the senior center.
 - **Future 99 Restaurant:** Sheehan advised the Board that they've heard that the 99 is delaying on building projects until they are in a better position to open. They anticipate that the project will begin in a few months and will take 3-5 months to complete.
 - **Public Facilities Complex:** The Master Development Planning Committee will be at the next Board meeting to discuss the public facilities project at 105 S. Main Street.

7:17 PM **Public Comment Period:** There were no public comments.

7:17 PM **FY2021 Tax Classification Hearing:** Brad Swanson, Assistant Assessor, met with the Board of Selectman with a review of Fiscal Year 2021 final valuations approved by state Department of Revenue; votes required under Massachusetts General Law, Chapter 59, Section 2, which included the following:

1. To discount up to 25% of Open Space (No, as there are no qualifying parcels)
2. To adopt up to a 20% Residential Exemption (Yes or No, and if Yes, at what %)
3. To adopt up to a 10% Small Commercial Exemption (No, as there are no eligible parcels)
4. To determine the percentage of the tax levy to be borne by the two main property classes:
 - Residential and CIP (Commercial, Industrial and Personal):
 1. 100% factor or unity for both classes
 2. A CIP factor between 100-150% of Residential factor as shown on options chart

After a very brief discussion, the Board took the following actions:

On a **MOTION** made by **Prentakis**, second by **Cresta**, the Board of Selectmen **VOTED** unanimously by roll call vote to open the Classification Hearing.

7:29 PM FY22 Budget Discussion: Town Administrator Andy Sheehan provided the Board with a memo outlining his expectations for the FY22 budget discussions, touching on revenues and expenditures, FY22 budget preview, budget instructions, and capital budget. He summarized by noting that he expects the budget to go through multiple versions between now and Town Meeting.

7:45 PM Discussion of 2021 License Renewal Fees: Selectman Prentakis began the discussion, noting that he is in favor of reduced license renewal fees for alcohol sales, other than for package stores. After a brief discussion, the Board took the following action:

Part I ADMINISTRATION OF THE GOVERNMENT

A.

Title VII CITIES, TOWNS AND DISTRICTS

Chapter MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT
39

Section 10 WARRANT; ISSUANCE; CONTENTS

Section 10. Every town meeting or town election, except as hereinafter provided, shall be called in pursuance of a warrant, under the hands of the selectmen, notice of which shall be given at least seven days before the annual meeting or an annual or special election and at least fourteen days before any special town meeting. The warrant shall be directed to the constables or to some other persons, who shall forthwith give notice of such meeting in the manner prescribed by the by-laws, or, if there are no by-laws, by a vote of the town, or in a manner approved by the attorney general. The warrant for all town meetings shall state the time and place of holding the meeting and the subjects to be acted upon thereat. The town meeting may be held in one or more places; provided, that if it is held in more than one place, the places are connected by means of a public address system and loud speakers so that the proceedings in all such places may be heard and participated in by all the voters present therein. Whenever the moderator determines that voters are being excluded from the town meeting because there is no room for them in the places provided or that voters in attendance are being deprived of the opportunity to participate therein for any reason whatsoever, he shall either, on his own motion recess the meeting for any period during the day of the meeting or, after consultation with the members of the board of selectmen then present, adjourn the same to another date, not later than fourteen days following the date of said meeting, when places and facilities sufficient to accommodate all voters attending and to enable them to participate therein shall be available. The selectmen shall insert in the warrant for the annual meeting all subjects the insertion of which shall be requested of them in writing by ten or more registered voters of the town and in the warrant for every special town meeting all subjects the insertion of which shall be requested of them in writing by one hundred registered voters or by ten per cent of the total number of registered voters of the town whichever number is the lesser. The selectmen shall call a special town meeting upon request in writing, of two hundred registered voters or of twenty per cent of the total number of registered voters of the town, whichever number is the lesser; such meeting to be held not later than forty-five days after the receipt of such request, and shall insert in the warrant therefor all subjects the insertion of which shall be requested by said petition. No action shall be valid unless the subject matter thereof is contained in the warrant. Two or more distinct town meetings for distinct purposes may be called by the same warrant.

The written requests of registered voters for the insertion of subjects in town meeting warrants shall not be valid unless the required number of registered voters not only sign their names but also state their residence, with street and number, if any. The selectmen shall submit such written requests to the board of registrars of voters or the board of election commissioners who shall check and forthwith certify the number of signatures so checked which are names of voters in the town, and only names so checked and certified shall be counted. A greater number of names than are required in each case need not be certified.
